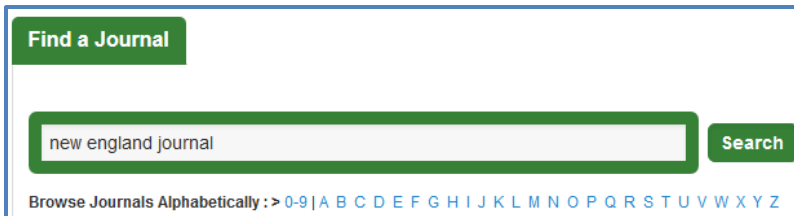




Find a Journal

Use Find a Journal search to locate specific journals

1. Select RMH, RWH or PMCC Resources. If prompted, enter your library barcode.
2. Enter the title, partial title, or journal abbreviation into the search box, or use the A - Z links.



3. When the journal list displays, click on the **journal title** or the **red SFX icon**  to proceed. Use the **i icon**  to see journal information.



4. Check **availability**. Many journals are available from multiple sources. Look for start date, end date & embargo information (full text not available).



Find a Journal Search – Locate a citation

Use Find a Journal search to locate citations in a journal

You can map to a specific citation from the journal title level in Find a Journal search.

Example:

2. Enter citation data as shown below, then click GO. In most cases, the article opens directly in a new tab, however this is dependent on the publisher's site & sometimes more steps are required to open the article.

When to use CitationLinker

Most citations can be located using the Find an Article search, however some citations, such as 'Epub ahead of print', are not fully indexed & can't be found through the Find an Article search. CitationLinker has several searchable fields, including PMID & DOI that can be used to locate articles.

Example: Using the PMID number in CitationLinker.

1. From the CitationLinker tab, enter PMID number into appropriate search box, then click GO. In most cases, the article opens directly in a new tab, however this is dependent on the publisher's site & sometimes more steps are required to open the article.
